To learn more about the important topic of cybersecurity, please come to an informational cybersecurity seminar that I am hosting in conjunction with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on **Friday, May 31 from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. at Ohio Northern University in Ada, Ohio.** The seminar is entitled "Combating Cyber Crime: How to Protect Your Identity and Business Online" and will be held in the Dicke Forum, in the James F. Dicke Hall.

Without question, cyber crime affects everyone and cybersecurity is critical for any business with an online presence. According to Symantec's 2011 State of Security report, 71 percent of companies experienced some form of cyber attack in that year; and on the consumer side, the 2012 Norton Cybercrime Report estimates that globally, there are 18 victims of cybercrime per second. The good news is that awareness and preventive steps can go a long way in protecting your business. The May 31 session will feature presentations with practical information and tips by the Cleveland FBI Cyber Action Team, as well as Loren Wagner, an adjunct senior lecturer at The University of Findlay who teaches upper level courses in Information Assurance.

Cybersecurity cannot be ignored. After participating in the House Republican Cybersecurity Task Force and the bipartisan Communications and Technology Cybersecurity Working Group, I feel strongly about this issue and want to make sure that businesses in Ohio are informed and well-equipped to deal with cyber attacks.
