Dear President Biden:

We write regarding the announcement that the Department of Energy (DOE) will stop issuing indefinitely permits to export liquefied natural gas (LNG) while your administration conducts an additional "public interest" review, including environmental, economic, and environmental justice criteria. This is economically and strategically dangerous and unnecessary. Under both Democratic and Republican administrations, DOE has consistently found that U.S. LNG exports serve the "public interest" because they contribute positive economic benefits and strengthen energy security for the American people, and also have the potential to reduce global greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.²

We stand at a pivotal moment. Our European allies are desperately seeking American energy to counter Russia's weaponization of its natural gas exports. In December 2023, over 87 percent of U.S. LNG exports went to the European Union, United Kingdom, or Asian markets.³ Actions that slow or halt the ability to export U.S. LNG would weaken global energy security and put these strategic markets at risk. Such actions would undercut efforts we have made to help Europe reduce its reliance on Russian energy. Such actions would also interfere with domestic markets for natural gas, jeopardizing the stability and affordability of prices for American consumers.

Your administration should do everything it can to encourage greater production of cleanburning and reliable natural gas, and to grant the export permits that allow access to global

markets. In just seven years, the U.S. has increased its LNG export capacity from zero to 11.6 billion cubic feet per day (Bcf/d).⁴ During the same period, the spot price of U.S. natural gas has remained relatively stable and affordable. The average Henry Hub spot price in December 2023 was just 53 cents higher than when LNG was exported from the United States in February 2016.⁵ This has occurred despite the rampant inflation that has hampered our economy since 2021. Additionally, U.S. LNG has played a key role in reducing global energy prices. Notably, U.S. LNG helped reduce natural gas prices in Europe by over 83 percent from 2022 levels following Russia's invasion of Ukraine.⁶

American natural gas producers and exporters are primed to build on these successes. With five LNG export projects currently under construction with a combined 9.7 Bcf/d of export capacity, these projects will provide high-paying, stable jobs at every stage of the energy value chain, which helps all Americans. Studies show that LNG exports could add upwards of \$73 billion to the U.S. economy by 2040, create upwards of 453,000 American jobs, and increase U.S. held purchasing power by \$30 billion. Policies supporting LNG exports will grow our economy, create good paying jobs, and strengthen the energy security of our allies.

We urge you to end this unnecessary review and expeditiously approve all pending applications to increase the global supply of natural gas.
